

# Libby Arnold Stevens' Resident Stabilization Fund/ Emergency COVID Relief Fund

### Stabilizing year round residents through one-time emergency assistance for families and individuals on Cape Cod who are experiencing a temporary financial crisis.

Those helped by the Libby Arnold Stevens Resident Stabilization Fund/Emergency COVID Relief Fund do not receive cash. Payments are made directly to vendors. The Fund provides one-time emergency financial assistance for qualifying needs such as:

Housing – Rent or mortgage

Utilities - Electric, Gas, Oil, Propane

**\*Transportation -** Car insurance, car payment, repairs - **\***only if financial difficulty is COVID related **\*Childcare Expenses** - **\***only if financial difficulty is COVID related

Other Emergencies- as determined by the HECH staff and/or Board of Directors
